Day 1 :- Arrived Broome

You're about to spend the next 11 days with a group of similarly minded adventure-seekers who will likely become best friends before you even leave tonight's dinner venue. Break the ice over a few cool drinks and a suitably dazzling Broome sunset that sinks into the Indian Ocean with a sizzle.

Dinner

Day 2 :- Broome Free Day

Among the most multicultural cities in Australia, Broome became a base for fortune-seekers the world over during its 'pearl rush'. Many of them never left. The pristine waters here grow great oysters, and the resulting pearls are prized by lovers of all things that gleam. The hardest thing you have to do today is decide how to spend it. We have a few ideas. Opt to go to the source and see how pearls are painstakingly grown and harvested. Marvel at the intricate craftsmanship and discover the allure of these exquisite gems. Alternatively, you may opt to venture further afield and explore the natural wonders of the area. Speak to your Travel Director about the possibility of joining a scenic flight, soaring above the landscape to witness the awe-inspiring sights from above (all own expense). We wouldn't blame you for simply enjoying Broome's tropical climes, strolling along 22-kilometre Cable Beach, discovering colourful Chinatown then following locals to the sand, or a beachside bar, to salute the end of a spectacular day in WA.

Optional Experiences:

a. Pearl Museum Tour

Through daily guided tours and enthralling stories learn of the impact pearling has had upon Northern Australia and why such a large number of nationalities were enticed, often by force, into our pearling industry. Experience what it was like to be a pearl diver and discover why so many put their lives at risk. See two of Broome's last remaining wooden pearling luggers, taste the exclusive pearl meat from the pearl oyster, view artefacts from the early perilous days of deep-sea pearl diving, and see a pearl valued in excess of \$100,000.

b. Willie Creek Pearl Farm Tour

Located 38 kilometers north of Broome, the Willie Creek Pearl Farm is perfectly situated on the protected tidal estuary of Willie Creek. A natural harbour, the warm azure waters of the creek provide a perfect growing environment for the Pinctada maxima oyster and produces world renowned South Sea Pearls. At Willie Creek Pearl Farm you will gain a fascinating insight into the world of cultured pearling. On board our boat you will learn about modern pearling techniques and after refreshments your guide will demonstrate the intricate process of cultured pearling including the seeding of a live oyster shell.

c. Incredible Islands Tour

Departing Broome, track over the Chinatown and Roebuck Bay before heading to the Dampier Peninsula. View the ancient Kimbolton Ranges and the vastness of King Sound. Fly over the '8th Natural Wonder of the World' and witness astonishing rapid tidal movements unique to this region at the Horizontal Waterfalls. Marvel at the hundreds of islands that make up the Buccaneer Archipelago including Cockatoo Island and Koolan Island. Get an aerial view of Cape Leveque, witnessing the stunning red cliffs that meet the white sand and crystal-clear ocean. Land at Australia's oldest family owned and operated pearl farm at Cygnet Bay for a delicious breakfast or lunch and time to relax by the pool. Take a guided pearl farm tour learning the history of pearling and the methods of cultivating these beautiful and sought after jewels. Return to Broome via the coast flying over Pender Bay, Beagle Bay, Carnot Bay, James Price Point, Willie Creek and Cable Beach.

d. Sunset Cruise

Fancy the warmth and beauty of a magnificent Broome sunset aboard our beautifully appointed 50foot catamaran 'Orcaella'? Why not join us on a 3hour Broome sunset cruise? Meet our friendly team and enjoy delicious canapes as you cruise along the stunning coast. Purchase a beverage from our licensed bar or BYO drinks. Our crew will chill and serve them for you on board. Jump into our boom net to add some extra fun to your afternoon. Your friends and family will love it! On your return, listen to some chilled music and embrace the beautiful backdrop of the Kimberley sunset with your loved ones.

e. Whale Watching Sunset Cruise

Our Broome sunset cruise takes you on a 4.5-hour tour aboard our beautifully appointed catamaran 'Orcaella'. With shaded decks and comfortable seating 'Orcaella' is a fantastic stable platform. Our vessel provides great vantage points, giving you uninterrupted views of the world's largest population of humpback whales. Cruise the stunning waters of Broome, in search for these majestic whales. Come face to face with them in the friendliest way possible. Day 3 :- Broome - Fitzroy Crossing

At Gantheaume Point, the magnificence is on a grand scale, even in the remnants of ancient dinosaurs. Over 125 million years ago, these prehistoric creatures left their footprints along the coastline, leaving a fascinating legacy. Take a moment to catch a glimpse of their stomping ground before embarking on a journey towards Fitzroy Crossing, a remote town that serves as a gateway to captivating natural wonders. The Kimberley boasts a geological history that is nothing short of spectacular. The rugged terrain showcases a diverse range of natural wonders, including towering ancient rock formations, dramatic gorges, cascading waterfalls, and expansive river systems.

Breakfast Dinner

Day 4 :- Fitzroy Crossing - Halls Creek

This morning explore the spectacular Mimbi Caves with an Indigenous guide to observe the delicate limestone formations, brilliantly vivid colours and crystal-clear freshwater pools that remain from the Devonian Great Barrier Reef that formed over 350 million years ago. Discover ancient rock paintings before hearing Dreamtime stories while enjoying billy tea and damper. Dive deep into First Nations culture on a visit to an art gallery, a community venue supporting Aboriginal creatives in the region.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 5 :- Halls Creek - Emma Gorge

Get a taste of the Gibb River Road before arriving to El Questro Wilderness Park, backdropped by the rusty red Cockburn Range. Hidden among the pandanus palms are a string of slick safari-style tents. Which means you can gaze at the stars while you drift off to a chorus of frogs and cicadas. When darkness falls, expect a bedazzlement of stars overhead.

Day 6 :- El Questro Wilderness Park

The best way to wake up? With the sun streaming through your tent, wildlife all around. The Kimberley's sounds follow you across the mighty Pentecost River, a mecca for those who love a spot of barramundi fishing. Arriving at Chamberlain Gorge, an enormous fresh waterhole, your cruise chariot awaits. Jump aboard to feel very small indeed, your boat dwarfed by soaring 60-metre escarpments, a brilliant shade of orange in the morning sun. When it's time to cool down, take an afternoon dip in the resort's pool, perhaps.

Breakfast Dinner

Day 7 :- Emma Gorge - Kununurra

It's not every day that you have the privilege of glimpsing the inner workings of a rum distillery with the family that owns it. Thanks to our AAT Kings connections, we've organised for you to meet the makers and discover how Hoochery Distillery prepares its lip-smacking, award-winning rums and whiskys. Perhaps try a tasting paddle to get your heart started (own expense), and later sit down to morning tea. Kununurra is the middle of nowhere, and only exists because of the Ord River Irrigation Scheme. Before it was a twinkle on the map, farming pioneers came here to establish vast cattle stations. The life of one such family is chronicled at the Durack Homestead Museum, revealing how the property was dismantled then reassembled on higher ground when much of the countryside was flooded for the dam. The project not only helped water the countryside, but created Lake Argyle. An afternoon cruise here, surrounded by freshwater crocs and birds, is something you won't forget in a hurry.

Breakfast Dinner

Day 8 :- Kununurra Free Day

Today is one of decisions: A scenic flight over (or 4WD tour of) the dramatic World Heritage-listed Purnululu National Park, home to the Bungle Bungles (both own expense). Or a wander with your Travel Director through Mirima National Park, known as a 'mini Bungles', while hearing about how the landscapes were formed. In between, explore the Waringarri Aboriginal Art Centre on a guided tour, meeting Indigenous creatives at work and maybe picking up a piece to take home. The ultimate souvenir.

Optional Experiences:

a. Bungle Bungle Adventurer Scenic Flight

From an aircraft, Purnululu National Park is an imposing sight. This 2-hour scenic flight takes you on an unforgettable adventure over the Bungle Bungle Range, Lake Argyle, the Argyle Diamond Mine and Ord River Irrigation Area. You will also fly over the stunning Carr Boyd Ranges, Osmand Ranges, the Ord River and the Bow River. Your aircraft is an air-conditioned, high wing, beautifully presented aeroplane offering comfort, safety and spectacular viewing opportunities. This award-winning scenic flight from Kununurra to the Purnululu National Park is an exhilarating adventure taking in the Kimberley's best scenic views.

b. Bungle Bungle Flight & 4WD Tour

Experience aerial views of the Bungle Bungle in Purnululu National Park before landing and transferring to a 4WD bus for a guided 3km walk among the eroded towers and beehive structures. Visit Cathedral Gorge, walk along Piccaninny Creek, learn about the Kimberley climate, and return via a scenic flight over the Argyle Diamond Mine. DIFFICULTY: This is a moderate 3km walk along a creek bed with sand and loose stones, short rocky slopes and a ladder with double handrails

Day 9 :- Kununurra - Katherine

Say goodbye to WA and hello to the NT, your introduction to the state the vast pastoral lands that characterise the outback here. Locals come with plenty of country swagger, as you'll discover at the Katherine Outback Experience, celebrating the Northern Territory's unique pastoral history and culture. After songs and entertainment, your special Be My Guest evening of dining under the stars begins.

Day 10 :- Katherine - Darwin

Nature reigns supreme at Nitmiluk National Park. This is Jawoyn land, and a place where you'll feel your spirit soar. Particularly when you're cruising through dramatic Nitmiluk Gorge, your boat the only sound in this enormous chasm. The balmy Darwin climate sets the pace for your final city tour: relaxed.
