


# **10D9N Iceland Ring Road Adventure (Summer)**

**Tour Itinerary** 

## Day 1 :- Arrive Reykjavik

Arrival at Keflavík airport and transferred to the Reykjavík city centre hotel. Optional Blue Lagoon with comfort entrance can be added. Price from RM600 per person

## Day 2 :- Thingvellir National Park – Geysir – Gullfoss

Start your day with breakfast at the hotel before meeting your guide for an Iceland adventure. Begin with a brief tour of Reykjavík, then head to Þingvellir National Park, a UNESCO site where the world's oldest parliament was founded and where you can walk between the North American and European tectonic plates.

Continue to Gullfoss, the stunning "Golden Waterfall," and explore the Geysir hot spring area, where Strokkur erupts regularly. Experience Icelandic local life with a visit to a family-run farm that grows tomatoes using geothermal energy, with a chance to tour the greenhouse and taste fresh Icelandic tomatoes.

End the day with dinner and an overnight stay in the Golden Circle area.

#### **Breakfast Dinner**

### Day 3 :- Thjorsardalur Valley – Skógar – Dyrhólaey – Vík

Day begins with breakfast at your hotel. You'll explore Þjórsárdalur valley, known for its diverse landscapes including birch woods, lava fields, rivers, and waterfalls. If the weather permits, you'll get a view of Mt. Hekla, a prominent volcano. Visit Stöng to see a replica of a Viking-age longhouse buried by a volcanic eruption, famously a Game of Thrones Season 4 filming location.

Next, drive through the picturesque farmlands of Iceland's South Shore, stopping at Seljalandsfoss and Skógafoss waterfalls, each with its own unique charm. Proceed to Dyrhólaey\*, a natural rock arch, and Reynisfjara's black sand beaches, known for their dramatic waves. The day concludes in Vík, Iceland's southernmost town.

Enjoy dinner and stay overnight in the Vík area.

\*Note: Dyrhólaey is closed for bird nesting from mid-May to June 25th.

## Day 4 :- Vatnajökull National Park – Jökulsárlón Glacial Lagoon – Höfn

Start your day with breakfast at your hotel before exploring the glacier-filled landscapes of Vatnajökull National Park, home to Europe's largest glacier. Drive through vast sand plains shaped by glacial outwashes as you head east.

Visit the stunning Skaftafell area, known for its lush green scenery, black sands, and breathtaking glaciers, including Svínafellsjökull, a striking glacial tongue extending from Vatnajökull.

Next, stop at Jökulsárlón Glacier Lagoon to witness floating icebergs in the deep, icy waters. You can also take an optional boat tour among the icebergs (advance booking required). Nearby, visit the stunning Diamond Beach, where melting icebergs rest on black sand before drifting into the sea.

End your day in Höfn, a fishing town near Vatnajökull, known for its langoustines. Dinner is at your leisure, with various restaurants and cafés available.

## Day 5 :- Höfn – Eastfjords – Egilsstaðir

After breakfast, drive from Höfn through Almannaskarð pass, stopping to admire the stunning coastline. Continue through the Eastfjords, where towering mountains plunge into the sea, offering breathtaking views. Pass through charming villages, including Breiðdalsvík, where you'll visit Beljandi Microbrewery to sample locally crafted beer and learn about small-town Icelandic life.

Arrive in Egilsstaðir, a town near Iceland's largest forest and a lake rumored to be home to a legendary friendly monster.

Enjoy dinner and an overnight stay in the Egilsstaðir area.

#### **Breakfast Dinner**

## Day 6 :- Lake Mývatn Area

Start your day with breakfast at your hotel before exploring the vast, hauntingly beautiful highland desert plateau of Möðrudalsöræfi on your way to Lake Mývatn.

Visit Stuðlagil Canyon, one of Iceland's largest basalt formations, with striking column-like structures. Stop at Dettifoss, Europe's most powerful waterfall, before heading to Námaskarð pass, where boiling mud pools and vivid colors create a surreal, otherworldly landscape.

Walk along the pseudo-craters at Skútustaðir, peek into Grjótagjá cave with its underground hot springs, and explore the eerie lava formations at Dimmuborgir, believed to be home to elves.

End the day with dinner and an overnight stay in the Mývatn area, known for its stunning movie-like scenery.

## Day 7 :- Lake Mývatn Area – Godafoss – Akureyri

Start your day with breakfast at your hotel before exploring the highlights of the Mývatn area. Then, visit Godafoss, one of North Iceland's most iconic waterfalls, and learn about its fascinating history.

Continue to Akureyri, the vibrant "capital" of North Iceland, known for its charming architecture and stunning views of Eyjafjörður fjord. The rest of the day is free for you to explore. Visit the Listagil (Art Canyon) for galleries and cafés, explore museums, or stroll through the botanical garden, which thrives despite its Arctic location.

Enjoy dinner at one of Akureyri's many restaurants before overnighting in Akureyri.

## Day 8 :- Skagafjordur Borgarnes

After breakfast, drive through scenic valleys surrounded by dramatic mountains to Skagafjörður, a region famous for Icelandic horse breeding. Learn about this unique breed and its special fifth gait, the tölt, unchanged since Viking times.

Continue across the Holtavörðuheiði plateau into West Iceland, passing through Borgarfjörður, known for its volcanic landscapes, woodlands, and Viking history. Visit Deildartunguhver, Europe's most powerful hot spring, and admire the Hraunfossar waterfalls, where bright blue water flows through black lava formations. Nearby, see Barnafoss, a waterfall with stunning blue hues and a legendary story.

End the day with dinner and an overnight stay in the Borgarfjörður area.

## Day 9 :- Borgarfjordur – Snæfellsjokull National Park – Reykjavik

After breakfast, explore the natural beauty of Snæfellsjökull National Park, home to the Snæfellsjökull glacier, which sits atop a dormant volcano. Visit Kirkjufell, one of Iceland's most photographed mountains, and walk along the pebbled shores of Djúpalónssandur beach. In Arnarstapi, admire the impressive basalt rock formations.

An Icelandic Saga says the area is protected by a half-troll living on the glacier, adding a sense of magic to the experience.

Visit the Bjarnarhöfn Shark Museum to learn about Iceland's traditional cured shark meat, hákarl, and sample it if you're brave enough.

In the afternoon, return to Reykjavík for an overnight stay. Dinner is at your leisure.
