Tour Itinerary

Day 1 :- Arrive in Entebbe

Welcome to Entebbe, surrounded by the Ziki Forest near the shores of Lake Victoria. Hotel rooms are available for mid-afternoon check-in.

Day 2 :- Entebbe - Kihiki - Bwindi Impenetrable National Park

After breakfast, board your flight to Kihiki, where you will be met on arrival and transferred to your lodge near Bwindi Impenetrable National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and your base for gorilla trekking. Following a relaxing lunch at the lodge, set out on a guided nature walk through the lush, exotic gardens overlooking the Munyanga River. Keep your eyes peeled for vibrant birdlife, including the African Green Broadbill, Turacos, and the striking Grey-crowned Crane. This is the perfect introduction to the remarkable biodiversity of Bwindi.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 3 :- Bwindi Impenetrable National Park

This morning, gather for an insightful briefing from expert rangers before setting out on your unforgettable gorilla trek. Accompanied by skilled trackers, your journey through the dense, emerald terrain of the rainforest in search of one of Bwindi's remarkable gorilla families. The trek can take up to seven hours up steep, often muddy and slippery terrain, depending on where the gorillas have moved, but the reward is extraordinary: once a family is located, you will have a full hour to quietly observe them as they eat, groom, and play an intimate wildlife encounter unlike any other. Tonight, over dinner, relive the adrenaline-charged moments and trade stories from the trail as you offer a heartfelt farewell to your guide and the incredible wilds of Uganda.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 4 :- Bwindi Impenetrable National Park - Kihiki - Entebbe - Nairobi

This morning, return to Kihiki for your flight to Entebbe, connecting onward to Nairobi. You will arrive in Nairobi by mid-afternoon, with the remainder of the day free to relax, explore, or simply unwind at your leisure.

Breakfast

Day 5 :- Nairobi

Guided sightseeing starts with a game drive in Nairobi National Park. Then visit Sheldrick Wildlife Trust to learn about elephant conservation, including orphaned elephant calves. As part of Globus family of brands Lighthouse Project, your visit contributes to the Trust's mission. Visit Karen Blixen Museum, dedicated to the Danish baroness and author of Out of Africa, a 1937 autobiographical account (later, an Academy Award winning film) illustrating her experience as a coffee farmer and connections with Kenya. After lunch at the gardens, visit the Giraffe Centre, followed by free time this evening.

Breakfast Lunch

Day 6 :- Nairobi - Ol Pejeta Conservancy

Drive north out of the city to Ol Pejeta Conservancy, the largest rhino sanctuary in East Africa. The conservancy is home to the last two northern white rhinos and over 165 critically endangered black rhinos. After lunch and some time to settle in, embark on a game drive to begin your search for the Big 5: lion, leopard, elephant, rhino, and Cape buffalo. End the day with an exclusive welcome barbecue dinner in the bush.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 7 :- Ol Pejeta

Rise early for a morning game drive with beautiful Mount Kenya as the backdrop. Beyond the Big 5, you may spot cheetah, zebra, gazelle, and more. If you are lucky, you might even spot rare wild dogs. After some down time and lunch, visit the Sweetwaters Chimpanzee Sanctuary then set out on an afternoon game drive. Dinner at camp concludes your first full day on safari!

Day 8 :- Ol Pejeta - Nyahururu Falls - Lake Nakuru National Park

Leave Ol Pejeta and journey through the beautiful Kenyan highlands, one of the most fertile agricultural areas in all of Africa. Stop at the dramatic Nyahururu Falls and then on to Lake Nakuru National Park for an afternoon game drive and a chance to see giraffe, impala, flamingo, striped hyena, and a variety of birdlife along the water's edge. Lake Nakuru National Park is home to the largest euphorbia forest in Africa, an important pollination and food source for bees and black rhinos, yet toxic to many animals.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 9 :- Lake Nakuru - Maasai Mara National Reserve

This morning, depart for Maasai Mara National Reserve, Kenya's most famous game area. The Mara, as it is called by locals, is part of the Serengeti ecosystem and boasts a strong permanent population of game. When the Great Migration of wildebeest and zebra arrive, typically from August to early November, their population grows by almost 2 million – a bountiful food source for predators such as lion, cheetah, leopard, and hyena. As part of Globus family of brands Lighthouse Project, your visit contributes to Wildlife Conservation Network's Lion Recovery Fund, aimed at recovering the lion population in Africa. After lunch at your lodge, set out on an afternoon game drive. Each night, enjoy a dinner experience showcasing the fresh, locally grown produce from the onsite garden.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 10 :- Maasai Mara

Rise early for a morning game drive including an exclusive bush breakfast. Be sure to watch for elephant, rhino, giraffe, topi, hyena, and much more. Return to the camp and relax prior to your afternoon game drive.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 11 :- Maasai Mara - Amboseli National Park

This morning, choose to join an early morning game drive or opt to rest at the lodge. After breakfast, fly to Amboseli National Park, known for spectacular views of Mount Kilimanjaro or as the locals call it, the highest mountain in Africa. After lunch at the lodge, embark on an afternoon game drive.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 12 :- Amboseli

Morning and afternoon game drives are included today. Amboseli affords you a terrific opportunity to get close to the mighty elephant. You may spot Cape buffalo, zebra, wild dog, and more. Visit a Maasai village to learn more about their way of life and stop for sundowner drinks prior to returning to your lodge for dinner.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 13 :- Amboseli - Arusha, Tanzania - Lake Manyara National Park

This morning, enter Tanzania at the Namanga border. Enjoy lunch at Arusha's largest coffee plantation. Witness the colorful culture in the villages and diverse ecosystems en route to your lodge along the rim of the Great Rift Valley escarpment. Check in and enjoy leisure time prior to dinner. Consider a visit to a local village for a market experience or a nature walk on the safari lodge property.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 14 :- Lake Manyara - Karatu - Ngorongoro Conservation Area

Lake Manyara National Park is a small, ecologically diverse park with groundwater forests, grassy plains, and alkaline Lake Manyara itself. The park is also home to the world's largest concentration of baboon and over 300 migratory birds including flamingoes, long-crested eagles, and grey-headed kingfishers. Watch for the mischievous primates, giraffe, hippo, and more on your morning game drive. After lunch, journey to Karatu where you'll visit a local primary school. Continue to your lodge on the rim of Ngorongoro Crater, which is part of the larger Ngorongoro Conservation Area.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 15 :- Ngorongoro

Descend into the crater for a full-day game drive. Ngorongoro Crater is the world's largest unflooded caldera, more than 2,000 feet deep with a floor covering over 102 square miles. Game viewing here is fantastic, as most of the animals stay in this area year-round. This is your best chance to see the rare black rhinoceros, lion, Cape buffalo, hippo, elephants, and a variety of birds during this extraordinary experience. An exclusive bush lunch will be served in the crater. Tonight, enjoy a traditional Maasai dance performance.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 16 :- Ngorongoro - Serengeti National Park

Drive to Serengeti National Park, Tanzania's largest and most famous park. The Serengeti covers an area of roughly 5,700 square miles. The name comes from the Maasai word siringit, meaning endless plains. Enjoy lunch at your tented camp before an afternoon game drive. You have the chance to see the big cats lion, leopard, and cheetah as well as an abundance of other animals, including the Nile crocodile, giraffe, gazelle, and eland. You may even spot a caracal, a rare, beautiful cat with distinctive ears and strong hind legs.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 17 :- Serengeti

Continue your exploration during morning and afternoon game drives. Home to the annual Great Migration of wildebeest and zebra, generally between late November and July, the Serengeti attracts visitors from around the world and is great for year-round game viewing. Tonight, join a farewell dinner in the bush to celebrate your safari adventure.

Breakfast Lunch Dinner

Day 18 :- Serengeti - Arusha

Embark on one final game drive before flying back to Arusha, where a day room has been reserved at the Mount Meru Hotel for your use. Schedule departing flights after 5 pm.

u2022 All game viewing is conducted at your own risk and requires a signed liability waiver prior to travel.u2022 Due to rough terrain on and off-road between game reserves, this tour is not recommended for travelers with severe back or mobility conditions.u2022 Safari vehicles are customized 4WD vehicles designed for rough African terrain with high ground clearance.

Gorilla Trekking Guidelines

u2022 Mountain gorilla trekking in Bwindi Impenetrable National Park involves 2 to 7 hours of hiking across steep, rugged rainforest terrain at altitudes up to 2,600m.u2022 Moderate to good physical fitness is required.u2022 Minimum age for gorilla trekking permits is 15 years.u2022 Direct viewing time with gorilla families is strictly limited to 1 hour to protect wildlife.

Flight & Luggage Restrictions

u2022 Internal bush flights strictly enforce a maximum baggage limit of 15 kg (33 lbs) per traveler in soft-sided bags.u2022 Hard suitcases and wheeled luggage with rigid frames are not permitted on internal bush aircraft.u2022 Passengers exceeding 120 kg may be required to purchase an additional seat on small aircraft.

Visa & Entry Requirements

u2022 Entry visas are required for Uganda, Kenya, and Tanzania.u2022 The East Africa Tourist Visa covers entry to both Uganda and Kenya.u2022 Passports must be valid for at least 6 months beyond the departure date with at least 4 blank visa pages.

Health & Vaccinations

u2022 Yellow Fever vaccination certificate is mandatory for all travelers entering Uganda, Kenya, and Tanzania.u2022 Malaria prophylaxis is strongly advised for all safari destinations.
